

## Common Expressions using Comparatives

Any longer / no bigger	I've had enough! I'm <u>not</u> waiting <u>any longer!</u>
For negatives and questions	Let's stay here. It's <u>no more expensive</u> than the other place.
	You were ill yesterday. Do you feel <u>any better</u> today?
	Is this route <u>any quicker</u> ?
More and more / harder and harder	It's getting <u>harder and harder</u> to find work.
For something that is changing continuously and increasingly	It's more and more difficult to find good staff.
continuously and increasingly	My English is getting <u>better and better</u> .
The bigger the better	-When does this film end? - <u>The sooner the better!</u>
Meaning as big as possible	- I've invited all my friends Great! <u>The more the merrier</u> !
	Find the biggest box you can, <u>the bigger the better</u> .
Older or elder?	
The comparative of old is older	This building is <b>older than</b> it looks.
We use <b>elder</b> (or <b>older</b> ) to talk about members of a family	My <b>elder/older</b> sister lives in Birmingham.
Do not use <b>elder</b> to compare two things or people	My brother is <b>older</b> than me.

## Common Expressions using Superlatives

by far the most / -est	This is <u>by far the best</u> pizza restaurant in town!
	The Beatles were <u>by far the most popular</u> band in the 1960's
one of the most / -est	It's <u>one of the highest</u> mountains in the Alps.
	Jenny is <u>one of the most generous</u> people I know.
the second/third most / -est	Marseille is <u>the second largest</u> city in France
	The ancient city of Pompeii is <u>the third most visited</u> tourist site in Italy
the least	Trains are <u>the least expensive</u> way to travel in China.
	Let's find <u>the least challenging</u> route up the mountain

## Modifiers with Comparative and Superlatives: probably, possibly, definitely, almost certainly

This is **probably** the most difficult exam you will have to do this year.

George is **possibly** one of the funniest people I know.

Ronaldo is definitely one of the greatest football players in the world

You are <u>almost certainly</u> the best student in the class!

## Comparatives and Superlatives with the Present Perfect to describe experiences

This is the most delicious curry I have ever tasted!

It's quite possibly the most beautiful view we have ever seen.

I've watched more films than anyone else in my family.

That was the worst hotel I've ever had the misfortune to stay in.

<u>I've visited</u> more museums in Paris this week than <u>I've ever visited</u> anywhere else in my life.
