

Regular Past Tense: Pronunciation of -ed ending: [t], [d] & [id]

<u>-ed as [t]</u>

Voiceless sound: -p-k-s-ch-sh-f-x-h-pronounce-ed as [t]

hoped	asked
joked	lunched
jumped	briefed
laughed	brushed
locked	cooked
missed	danced
mixed	dropped

Remember that it depends on the ending <u>sound</u> of the verb, not the letter. For example, in *advise*, the 's' is pronounced as a [z]. Therefore, it doesn't have the [t] ending sound.

<u>-ed as [d]</u>

Voiced sound: -1-v-n-m-r-b-v-g-w-y-z- and vowel sounds **pronounce -ed as [d]**

called	filled

-ed as [id]

Verbs ending with -t or -d pronounce -ed as [id]

attended	invented
arrested	needed
contacted	printed
decided	provided
divided	respected
expected	started
invited	ended
