

Adverbs of Frequency

We use **adverbs of frequency** for repeated actions in the **Present Simple** tense.

ADVERBS	ADVERBIAL PHRASES
ALWAYS	EVERY DAY
OFTEN	ALL THE TIME
USUALLY/NORMALLY	MOST OF THE TIME
SOMETIMES	FROM TIME TO TIME
OCCASIONALLY	ONCE A WEEK
RARELY	TWICE A MONTH
NEVER	THREE TIMES A YEAR

Single word adverbs generally go **before** the verb:

I **always** wake up early. He **usually** goes to work by car. They **never** arrive late.

BUT with the verb 'to be' the adverb comes after the verb:

She is never on time.

He is often out at meetings.

We are **normally** with our family at Christmas.

Adverbial phrases (with more than one word) go at the end of the sentence:

We all meet at the café **twice a month**. They only visit us **once a year**. She practices the piano **every day**. They go out to the restaurant **from time to time**. You talk to your friends **all the time**.
